III. First conditional

Example:

Mr Kawahara says that you'll be fine if you ace the midterm.

Grammar Notes:

- We use the first conditional when we talk about future situations we believe are real or possible.
- In first conditional sentences, the structure is usually:

if/when + present simple >> will + infinitive (can + infinitive)

IV. Third Conditional

Example:

You would have had much more time if you'd come to me weeks ago when I'd asked.

Grammar Notes:

- The third conditional is used to imagine a different past. We imagine a change in a past situation and the different result of that change.
- In third conditional sentences, the structure is usually:

If + past perfect >> would have + past participle
